

Jeremiah 1:4-10

Before you were born I sanctified you;

I ordained you a prophet to the nations."

Behold, I cannot speak, for I am a youth."

For you shall go to all to whom I send you,

THE EPISTLE LESSON

1 Corinthians 13:1-13

13 Though I speak with the tongues of men and of angels, but have not love, I have become sounding brass or a clanging cymbal. ² And though I have *the gift of* prophecy, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and though I have all faith, so that I could remove mountains, but have not love, I am nothing. ³ And though I bestow all my goods to feed *the poor*, and though I give my body to be burned, but have not love, it profits me nothing. ⁴ Love suffers long *and* is kind; love does not envy; love does not parade itself, is not puffed up; ⁵ does not behave rudely, does not seek its own, is not provoked, thinks no evil; ⁶ does not rejoice in iniquity, but rejoices in the truth; ⁷ bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. ⁸ Love never fails. But whether *there are* prophecies, they will fail; whether *there are* tongues, they will cease; whether *there is* knowledge, it will vanish away. ⁹ For we know in part and we prophesy in part. ¹⁰ But when that which is perfect has come, then that which is in part will be done

THE GOSPEL LESSON

Luke 4:31-44

³¹ Then He went down to Capernaum, a city of Galilee, and was teaching them on the Sabbaths. 32 And they were astonished at His teaching, for His word was with authority. 33 Now in the synagogue there was a man who had a spirit of an unclean demon. And he cried out with a loud voice, ³⁴ saying, "Let us alone! What have we to do with You, Jesus of Nazareth? Did You come to destroy us? I know who You are—the Holy One of God!" 35 But Jesus rebuked him, saying, "Be quiet, and come out of him!" And when the demon had thrown him in their midst, it came out of him and did not hurt him. ³⁶ Then they were all amazed and spoke among themselves, saying, "What a word this is! For with authority and power He commands the unclean spirits, and they come out." 37 And the report about Him went out into every place in the surrounding region.³⁸ Now He arose from the synagogue and entered Simon's house. But Simon's wife's mother was sick with a high fever, and they made request of Him concerning her. ³⁹ So He stood over her and rebuked the fever, and it left her. And immediately she arose and served them. 40 When the sun was setting, all those who had any that were sick with various diseases brought them to Him; and He laid His hands on every one of them and healed them. 41 And demons also came out of many, crying out and saying, "You are the Christ, the Son of God!" And He, rebuking them, did not allow them to speak, for they knew that He was the Christ. 42 Now when it was day, He departed and went into a deserted place. And the crowd sought Him and came to Him, and tried to keep Him from leaving them; 43 but He said to them, "I must preach the kingdom of God to the other cities also, because for this purpose I have been sent." 44 And He was preaching in the synagogues of Galilee.





You Have a Place at Grace

"IN You, O LORD, I put my trust; Let me never be put to shame" (Psalm 71:6).

When we think about these words, excuses for self-righteousness wither away. Worry alone shows our trust in the wrong things, otherwise we wouldn't worry. Our trust in God would bring ease and we'd be fine all our days. Clearly this isn't the case, as even faithful saints struggle between faith and doubt, trust and despair. The theological meaning behind all this resides in the phrase *simul justus et peccatur*, "simultaneously saint and sinner." Never does spiritual combat cease this side of heaven. We carry the flesh and it's a heavy burden.

The Psalmist was no stranger to sin. He knew well the importance of seeking salvation outside of himself when He cried "save me, O God! For the waters have come up to my neck" (Psalm 69:1). We know the feeling. The waters are at the chin, getting into the mouth, choking is coming, drowning, imminent. Faith cries to God and He is swift to save in His promise that never ends. The Gospel is good news faith apprehends. Faith receives Christ and with Christ there's always salvation in the flood waters.

Praying the Psalms teach us about enemies, sin, and salvation in God alone. They teach God as the "rock" and "refuge," a "strong habitation" for sinners needing help. We forget these things and seek other fortifications that prove to be on foundations of sand. But times of despair don't overthrow the divine Word. Suffering doesn't overcome Jesus' promise to save, deliver, rescue, and bring to calm waters and green pastures. Another reason for praying the Psalms is they teach perseverance. They teach holding onto the Word of God when everything is failing, crumbling, and the waters are up to the neck. The Psalms exemplify faith surviving the storms from saints crying to the God Who promises to hear His children.

May God help us to pray, rid us of fear, and set our eyes on Him when trouble comes. Light shines in the darkness with the words "IN You, O LORD, I put my trust; Let me never be put to shame."
