THE FIRST READING

Revelation 7:9-17

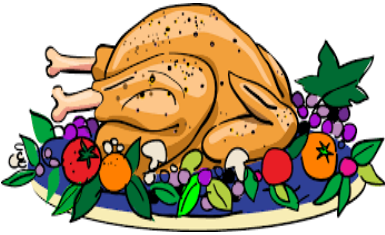

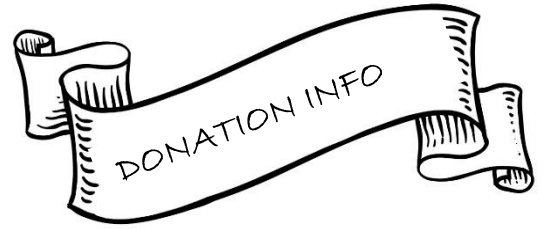

You Have a Place at Grace

“These are the ones who come out of the great tribulation, and washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb” (Rev.7:14).

All Saints Day appears in the late 4th century with the purpose of commemorating the saints of God. Today some churches specifically mention saints recently departed which historically happened on another day, All Souls Day. It fell out of vogue during the Reformation, and never returned to any meaningful level, which isn't to say it's forbidden, only uncommon. All Saints Day can be a “catch all” day for saints, as congregations in their liberty may choose to recall the faithful who have recently received that divine inheritance and now rest in the presence of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

Rome has a litany of saint days, and the Lutheran Confessions had to confront the problem of idolizing the saints while not disregarding them entirely. We have our saint days scattered throughout the church year, and the Confessions back why this is worthwhile. The saints show God's mercy in dispersing His gifts through people, His forgiveness towards saints like Peter who denied Christ, and give examples to imitate. The line falls before worshiping saints or calling upon them to advocate. Christ alone is our Intercessor and Advocate, not Mary and others. I saw a bumper sticker the other day that read “through Mary to Jesus” and this is as false today as it was in Luther's time, showing the stubbornness of false theology even in the face of clear biblical texts.

Who is a saint? The saint is the “holy one” made holy in Christ. The “communion of saints” we confess in the Apostles Creed includes the fellowship of believers, the ones washed and redeemed living by faith on earth along with those rejoicing in Heaven. It's far from wrong to notice those saints of old, who have done great deeds; we only give credit to where it's due. God is the provider of those people serving in His Kingdom to do great things for the sake of His Church. And though the world rages in these times of tribulation, Revelation teaches us the outcome, that the saints survive in Christ. Their robes are “white in the blood of the Lamb” and it's Jesus Who makes them pure.
