

The Sacrament of the Altar will be celebrated today. Grace Lutheran practices closed communion, for God's Word teaches and we believe that communicants receive the very body and the very blood of Jesus in, with, and under the bread and wine. God's Word also teaches and we believe that one who eats and drinks while denying the real presence and the benefits and blessings of the Sacrament, eats and drinks judgment upon himself. As the Christian Church is charged with the responsibility of "stewardship of the mysteries of God," we therefore ask that all who are not communicant members of Grace Lutheran please speak with one of our Pastors before communing. Our Pastors will assist you in becoming a communicant member through instruction in all the articles of faith, give you opportunity to publicly confirm your faith, and shepherd you as a member in good standing of this congregation. Those guests who are members in good stead of a sister Missouri Synod congregation and have previously spoken to our Pastors need only sign a communion card which is located in the pew. We trust that all will respect God's Word and our practice in accordance with its teachings.

THE OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

43 But now, thus says the Lord, who created you, O Jacob, and He who formed you, O Israel: "Fear not, for I have redeemed you; I have called *you* by your name; You *are* Mine.² When you pass through the waters, I *will be* with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overflow you. When you walk through the fire, you shall not be burned, nor shall the flame scorch you.³ For I *am* the Lord your God, the Holy One of Israel, your Savior; I gave Egypt for your ransom, Ethiopia and Seba in your place.⁴ Since you were precious in My sight, you have been honored, and I have loved you; Therefore I will give men for you, and people for your life.⁵ Fear not, for I *am* with you; I will bring your descendants from the east, and gather you from the west;⁶ I will say to the north, 'Give them up!' And to the south, 'Do not keep them back!' Bring My sons from afar, and My daughters from the ends of the earth—⁷ Everyone who is called by My name, whom I have created for My glory; I have formed him, yes, I have made him."

THE EPISTLE LESSON

6 What shall we say then? Shall we continue in sin that grace may abound? ² Certainly not! How shall we who died to sin live any longer in it? ³ Or do you not know that as many of us as were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death? ⁴ Therefore we were buried with Him through baptism into death, that just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life. ⁵ For if we have been united together in the likeness of His death, certainly we also shall be *in the likeness* of *His* resurrection, ⁶ knowing this, that our old man was crucified with *Him,* that the body of sin might be done away with, that we should no longer be slaves of sin. ⁷ For he who has died has been freed from sin. ⁸ Now if we died with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with Him, ⁹ knowing that Christ, having been raised from the dead, dies no more. Death no longer has dominion over Him. ¹⁰ For *the death* that He died, He died to sin once for all; but *the life* that He lives, He lives to God. ¹¹ Likewise you also, reckon yourselves to be dead indeed to sin, but alive to God in Christ Jesus our Lord.

¹⁵ Now as the people were in expectation, and all reasoned in their hearts about John, whether he was the Christ *or* not, ¹⁶ John answered, saying to all, "I indeed baptize you with water; but One mightier than I is coming, whose sandal strap I am not worthy to loose. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. ¹⁷ His winnowing fan *is* in His hand, and He will thoroughly clean out His threshing floor, and gather the wheat into His barn; but the chaff He will burn with unquenchable fire."¹⁸ And with many other exhortations he preached to the people. ¹⁹ But Herod the tetrarch, being rebuked by him concerning Herodias, his brother Philip's wife, and for all the evils which Herod had done, ²⁰ also added this, above all, that he shut John up in prison. ²¹ When all the people were baptized, it came to pass that Jesus also was baptized; and while He prayed, the heaven was opened. ²² And the Holy Spirit descended in bodily form like a dove upon Him, and a voice came from heaven which said, "You are My beloved Son; in You I am well pleased."


SERVING IN GOD'S HOUSE TODAY

You Have a Place at Grace

"Awake! Why do You sleep, O Lord? Arise! Do not cast us off forever. Why do You hide Your face, and forget our affliction and our oppression?" (Psalm 44:23-24).

Hear the imperatives of the Psalmist: "awake!" and "arise!" These are commands from the Psalmist calling God to action. Why? — because it seems God is hiding and has forgotten the affliction and oppression of His people.

Likely you've been in similar situations. Nothing is improving despite fervent, daily prayers. In fact, things may have gotten worse. Questions and doubt flood the mind: where is God in times of trial and tribulation? Where is God when the going goes from rough to rougher, and the tunnel's light turns out to be a train?

The dark times in life can certainly shroud the eyes from seeing God's goodness and love. Affliction and oppression make it seem the Church is now a headless body. But faith knows better and calls God to His promises. The Psalmist uses imperatives because he knows God's promises. He knows God's Word never to abandon His people and now petitions God to keep His Word, to look upon His beloved people with favor and grant them peace. Faith trusts in Christ, knows the forgiveness of sins earned by holy, precious blood, and that God doesn't abandon His redeemed people. "Awake" and "arise" we say to the God, our God, the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit Who invites us to pray, to call upon Him as "dear children ask their dear father" (see the Small Catechism, Intro on the Lord's Prayer).

And so, we press onward in the grace of our Lord anticipating that eternal Kingdom beyond what the eye has seen and the ear heard (1 Cor. 2:9). All is well in Jesus, and we have no reason to fear. Jesus lives and so does His Church. He's always awake to His people's cries, so pray, cry, shout. The Lord Jesus hears you.
