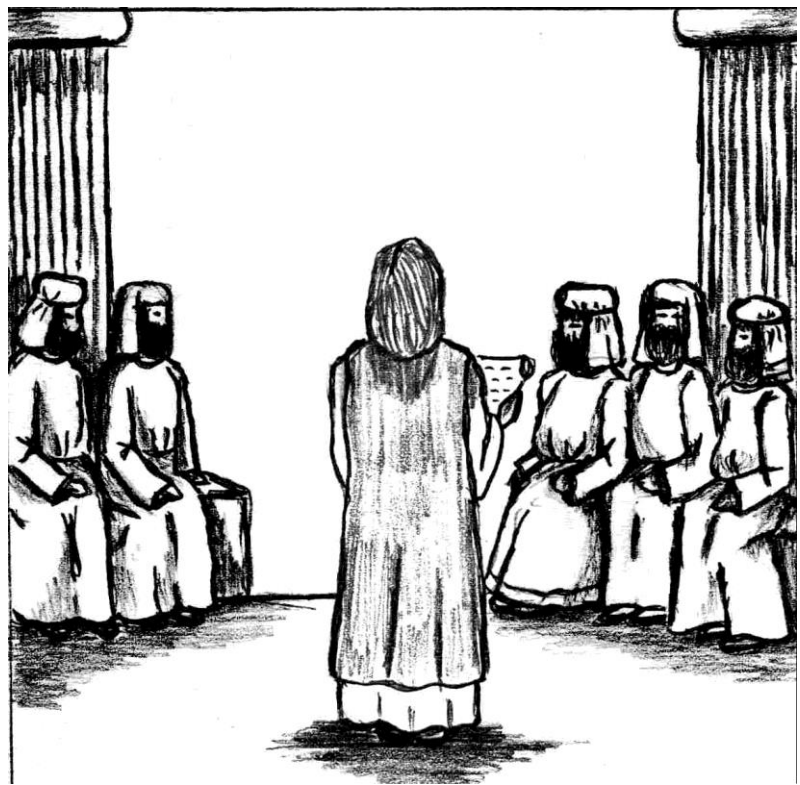

THE OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

Nehemiah 8:1-3, 5-6, 8-10

8 Now all the people gathered together as one man in the open square that was in front of the Water Gate; and they told Ezra the scribe to bring the Book of the Law of Moses, which the Lord had commanded Israel. ² So Ezra the priest brought the Law before the assembly of men and women and all who *could* hear with understanding on the first day of the seventh month. ³ Then he read from it in the open square that was in front of the Water Gate from morning until midday, before the men and women and those who could understand; and the ears of all the people *were attentive* to the Book of the Law. ⁵ And Ezra opened the book in the sight of all the people, for he was *standing* above all the people; and when he opened it, all the people stood up. ⁶ And Ezra blessed the Lord, the great God. Then all the people answered, "Amen, Amen!" while lifting up their hands. And they bowed their heads and worshiped the Lord with *their* faces to the ground. ⁸ So they read distinctly from the book, in the Law of God; and they gave the sense, and helped *them* to understand the reading. ⁹ And Nehemiah, who was the governor, Ezra the priest *and* scribe, and the Levites who taught the people said to all the people, "This day *is* holy to the Lord your God; do not mourn nor weep." For all the people wept, when they heard the words of the Law. ¹⁰ Then he said to them, "Go your way, eat the fat, drink the sweet, and send portions to those for whom nothing is prepared; for *this* day *is* holy to our Lord. Do not sorrow, for the joy of the Lord is your strength."

THE EPISTLE LESSON

1 Corinthians 12:12-31a

¹² For as the body is one and has many members, but all the members of that one body, being many, are one body, so also *is* Christ. ¹³ For by one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—whether Jews or Greeks, whether slaves or free—and have all been made to drink [\[a\]](#) into one Spirit. ¹⁴ For in fact the body is not one member but many. ¹⁵ If the foot should say, "Because I am not a hand, I am not of the body," is it therefore not of the body? ¹⁶ And if the ear should say, "Because I am not an eye, I am not of the body," is it therefore not of the body? ¹⁷ If the whole body *were* an eye, where *would be* the hearing?

If the whole *were* hearing, where *would be* the smelling? ¹⁸ But now God has set the members, each one of them, in the body just as He pleased. ¹⁹ And if they were all one member, where *would* the body *be*? ²⁰ But now indeed *there are* many members, yet one body. ²¹ And the eye cannot say to the hand, "I have no need of you"; nor again the head to the feet, "I have no need of you." ²² No, much rather, those members of the body which seem to be weaker are necessary. ²³ And those *members* of the body which we think to be less honorable, on these we bestow greater honor; and our unpresentable *parts* have greater modesty, ²⁴ but our presentable *parts* have no need. But God composed the body, having given greater honor to that *part* which lacks it, ²⁵ that there should be no schism in the body, but *that* the members should have the same care for one another. ²⁶ And if one member suffers, all the members suffer with *it* or if one member is honored, all the members rejoice with *it*. ²⁷ Now you are the body of Christ, and members individually. ²⁸ And God has appointed these in the church: first apostles, second prophets, third teachers, after that miracles, then gifts of healings, helps, administrations, varieties of tongues. ²⁹ *Are* all apostles? *Are* all prophets? *Are* all teachers? *Are* all workers of miracles? ³⁰ Do all have gifts of healings? Do all speak with tongues? Do all interpret? ³¹ But earnestly desire the best gifts. And yet I show you a more excellent way.

THE GOSPEL LESSON

Luke 4:16-30

¹⁶ So He came to Nazareth, where He had been brought up. And as His custom was, He went into the synagogue on the Sabbath day, and stood up to read. ¹⁷ And He was handed the book of the prophet Isaiah. And when He had opened the book, He found the place where it was written: ¹⁸ "The Spirit of the Lord *is* upon Me, because He has anointed Me to preach the gospel to *the* poor; He has sent Me to heal the brokenhearted, to proclaim liberty to *the* captives and recovery of sight to *the* blind, to set at liberty those who are oppressed; ¹⁹ To proclaim the acceptable year of the Lord." ²⁰ Then He closed the book, and gave *it* back to the attendant and sat down. And the eyes of all who were in the synagogue were fixed on Him. ²¹ And He began to say to them, "Today this Scripture is fulfilled in your hearing." ²² So all bore witness to Him, and marveled at the gracious words which proceeded out of His mouth. And they said, "Is this not Joseph's son?" ²³ He said to them, "You will surely say this proverb to Me, 'Physician, heal yourself! Whatever we have heard done in Capernaum, do also here in Your country.' " ²⁴ Then He said, "Assuredly, I say to you, no prophet is accepted in his own country. ²⁵ But I tell you truly, many widows were in Israel in the days of Elijah, when the heaven was shut up three years and six months, and there was a great famine throughout all the land; ²⁶ but to none of them was Elijah sent except to Zarephath, *in the region* of Sidon, to a woman *who was* a widow. ²⁷ And many lepers were in Israel in the time of Elisha the prophet, and none of them was cleansed except Naaman the Syrian." ²⁸ So all those in the synagogue, when they heard these things, were filled with wrath, ²⁹ and rose up and thrust Him out of the city; and they led Him to the brow of the hill on which their city was built, that they might throw Him down over the cliff. ³⁰ Then passing through the midst of them, He went His way.

You Have a Place at Grace

Luke 4:18-19 “The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to the captives and recovering of sight to the blind, to set at liberty those who are oppressed, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor.”

This quotation by Jesus is a conflation of multiple verses from Isaiah, which isn't uncommon for New Testament authors. Prophetic fulfillment in the person of Jesus is testified by the same Holy Spirit throughout all the Old Testament witnesses. Different verses compiled to form a single theological thought about the Christ is still the same Author's work and testimony. Scripture is inspired, whatever the passage, and points to the One sent to “set at liberty those who are oppressed.”

On that clause, the KJV reads “to set at liberty them who are bruised.” The Greek and Hebrew terms can mean “bruised” or “oppressed,” even “crushed.” Interestingly, the result of a word search for the Hebrew term most often yields translations like “bruised” and “crushed,” though “oppressed” occurs more than once and sometimes in tandem with the other renderings: “you shall be only oppressed and crushed continually...” (Deut.28:33). What do we make of this? The oppression we bear as sinners is what the KJV draws out in its translation. It crushes us. It's a burden, a weight we can't carry and the results are devastating under the conviction we can bear our sin without Divine aid.

Another occurrence of the Word is in Isaiah 42:3, “a bruised reed He will not break.” We certainly have deserved to be broken and rightly merit it under God's retribution. Sin has a price, and a just God against Whom we've sinned has every right to exact vengeance from the transgressor. Again, God's mercy is found only in Christ, Who takes such punishment in man's stead. The term “liberty” also has interesting connotations helping to paint a picture of God's salvific work. Other definitions include “forgiveness, deliverance, and remission.” Now the picture really comes into focus. Jesus comes not for some temporal liberty from human oppressors, or the liberty to sin in the shattering of an “oppressive” morality foisted upon us from generations old. He comes to free us from the tyranny of sin crushing us unto death, dragging us to hell, shackling us eternally to the fire that's never quenched.

Christ is always the “year of the Lord's favor.” The time is with Him, thus repent and believe, turn and live. The burdens, the weight, the crushing blows of sin—all of it falls on the Word made flesh Who still speaks “come to me all who labor and are heavy laden and I will give you rest” (Matt.11:28).
