THE OLD TESTAMENT LESSON

Exodus 20:1-17

And God spoke all these words, saying: "I am the LORD your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of bondage. "You shall have no other gods before Me. "You shall not make for yourself a carved image—any likeness of anything that is in heaven above, or that is in the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth; you shall not bow down to them nor serve them. For I, the LORD your God, am a jealous God, visiting the iniquity of the fathers upon the children to the third and fourth generations of those who hate Me, but showing mercy to thousands, to those who love Me and keep My commandments. "You shall not take the name of the LORD your God in vain, for the LORD will not hold him guiltless who takes His name in vain. "Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy. Six days you shall labor and do all your work, but the seventh day is the Sabbath of the LORD your God. In it you shall do no work: you, nor your son, nor your daughter, nor your male servant, nor your female servant, nor your cattle, nor your stranger who is within your gates. For in six days the LORD made the heavens and the earth, the sea, and all that is in them, and rested the seventh day. Therefore the LORD blessed the Sabbath day and hallowed it. "Honor your father and your mother, that your days may be long upon the land which the LORD your God is giving you. "You shall not murder. "You shall not commit adultery. "You shall not steal. "You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor. "You shall not covet your neighbor's house; you shall not covet your neighbor's wife, nor his male servant, nor his female servant, nor his ox, nor his donkey, nor anything that is your neighbor's."

THE EPISTLE LESSON

I Corinthians 1:18-31

For the message of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God. For it is written: "I will destroy the wisdom of the wise, And bring to nothing the understanding of the prudent." Where is the wise? Where is the scribe? Where is the disputer of this age? Has not God made foolish the wisdom of this world? For since, in the wisdom of God, the world through wisdom did not know God, it pleased God through the foolishness of the message preached to save those who believe. For Jews request a sign, and Greeks seek after wisdom; but we preach Christ crucified, to the Jews a stumbling block and to the Greeks foolishness, but to those who are called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. Because the foolishness of God is wiser than men, and the weakness of God is stronger than men. For you see your calling, brethren, that not many wise according to the flesh, not many mighty, not many noble, are called. But God has chosen the foolish things of the world to put to shame the wise, and God has chosen the weak things of the world to put to shame the things which are mighty; and the base things of the world and the things

which are despised God has chosen, and the things which are not, to bring to nothing the things that are, that no flesh should glory in His presence. But of Him you are in Christ Jesus, who became for us wisdom from God and righteousness and sanctification and redemption that, as it is written, "He who glories, let him glory in the LORD."

THE GOSPEL LESSON

John 2:13-22

Now the Passover of the Jews was at hand, and Jesus went up to Jerusalem. And He found in the temple those who sold oxen and sheep and doves, and the money changers doing business. When He had made a whip of cords, He drove them all out of the temple, with the sheep and the oxen, and poured out the changers' money and overturned the tables. And He said to those who sold doves, "Take these things away! Do not make My Father's house a house of merchandise!" Then His disciples remembered that it was written, "Zeal for Your house has eaten Me up." So the Jews answered and said to Him, "What sign do You show to us, since You do these things?" Jesus answered and said to them, "Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up." Then the Jews said, "It has taken forty-six years to build this temple, and will You raise it up in three days?" But He was speaking of the temple of His body. Therefore, when He had risen from the dead, His disciples remembered that He had said this to them; and they believed the Scripture and the word which Jesus had said.

Every Pastor worth his salt seeks to know the condition of his flock. Please make sure to inform the church office of any health-related issues in need of Pastoral care.



Grace Lutheran is continuing the Church's historic practice of administering the LORD's Blood in a chalice during Holy Communion. Should you wish to receive the Blood of Christ from the chalice at the altar, simply refrain from taking the individual cup when it passes, and the cup bearer will see to give you a sip from the chalice. Feel free to assist in this process. Saints in the back of the church will still receive the LORD's gifts first and have the option of individual cups or the chalice. We also beg your patience as we wait for the second chalice to arrive sometime in March. By the grace of God, having two chalices, one for each side should improve how we administer the LORD's gifts.

It is a blessed opportunity and privilege to serve the true Body and Blood of Christ to those saints unable to approach the altar. God continues to bring such saints to Grace. Therefore, we humbly ask worshipers to consider leaving the back row open for those needing Holy Communion brought to them in the Divine Service.

LCMS Stewardship Ministry: John 2:16 – *“And he told those who sold the pigeons, ‘Take these things away; do not make my Father’s house a house of trade.’”* The LORD's house is not a place to sell, but a place to receive and a place to give. It's not a place for our schemes and plans. Instead, the church is a place for the LORD's gracious giving and our faithful sacrifices in response.

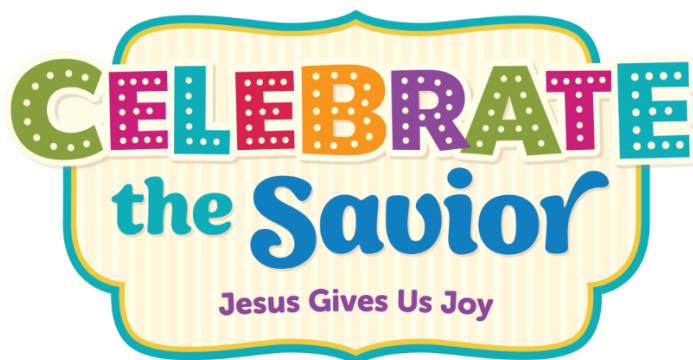

You Have a Place at Grace

For you, O God, have tested us; you have tried us as silver is tried. You brought us into the net; you laid a crushing burden on our backs; you let men ride over our heads; we went through fire and through water; yet you have brought us out to a place of abundance. (Psalm 66:10-12)

It's evident God is the subject in this passage. He's doing the testing, the trying, the bringing, the laying. He carries His people through fire and water before bringing them out to a "place of abundance." So, we see suffering before glory, lack before abundance, all by the will of God.

We can relate to the Psalmist and the hardships he confesses. Difficult times of trial and tribulation envelope everyone in this life, and it's easy to forget the good and sink into the abyss of searching for a reason. Job and his friends bantered back and forth over the cause of his suffering. His companions were convinced Job had done something wrong, for suffering was "the wicked man's portion from God, the heritage decreed for him by God" (Job. 20:29). Job, however, is resolute and won't apologize for something he didn't do. He maintains his innocence while lamenting his situation and questioning his own life.

It's easy to get lost chasing down reasons for our suffering, looking for some line between the cause and effect, sin and punishment. However, the Lutheran Confessions make clear not all suffering is a sign of punishment or wrath. In the Apology, article XII on Confession it states "troubles are not always punishments for certain past deeds, but they are God's works, intended for our benefit, and that God's power might be made more apparent in our weakness." This is expressed in Paul's words to the Romans: "tribulation produces perseverance; and perseverance, character; and character, hope" (Romans 5:3-4). I've always found this passage extremely helpful because it gives context to our suffering. The tribulations are often "intended for our benefit," to produce good things, a forging of our character before God as we pass through fires purifying us into something better. Trials are hard, but we don't forget them and the lessons they bring.

Christ is risen from the dead and His blood has reconciled the world to God. "Access" to God is by faith, and the Holy Spirit sustains us in "the one, true faith" (Small Catechism, 3rd article of the Apostles Creed). We anticipate the abundance God has in store, a time of satisfaction from lacking and wanting, begging, and needing. Our cups "overflow" and righteousness from all sin is ours that day He takes us from this vale of tears. These promises are certain and comforting in times of confusion. Trials shake everything up but God's Word is firmly fixed in the heavens. In Christ we can confess even now with the Psalmist "you have brought us out to a place of abundance."
