The next day a great multitude that had come to the feast, when they heard that Jesus was coming to Jerusalem, took branches of palm trees and went out to meet Him, and cried out: "Hosanna! 'Blessed is He who comes in the name of the LORD!' The King of Israel!" Then Jesus, when He had found a young donkey, sat on it; as it is written: "Fear not, daughter of Zion; Behold, your King is coming, Sitting on a donkey's colt." His disciples did not understand these things at first; but when Jesus was glorified, then they remembered that these things were written about Him and that they had done these things to Him. Therefore the people, who were with Him when He called Lazarus out of his tomb and raised him from the dead, bore witness. For this reason the people also met Him, because they heard that He had done this sign. The Pharisees therefore said among themselves, "You see that you are accomplishing nothing. Look, the world has gone after Him!" Now there were certain Greeks among those who came up to worship at the feast. Then they came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida of Galilee, and asked him, saying, "Sir, we wish to see Jesus." Philip came and told Andrew, and in turn Andrew and Philip told Jesus. But Jesus answered them, saying, "The hour has come that the Son of Man should be glorified. Most assuredly, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the ground and dies, it remains alone; but if it dies, it produces much grain. He who loves his life will lose it, and he who hates his life in this world will keep it for eternal life. If anyone serves Me, let him follow Me; and where I am, there My servant will be also. If anyone serves Me, him My Father will honor. "Now My soul is troubled, and what shall I say? 'Father, save Me from this hour'? But for this purpose I came to this hour. Father, glorify Your name." Then a voice came from heaven, saying, "I have both glorified it and will glorify it again." Therefore the people who stood by and heard it said that it had thundered. Others said, "An angel has spoken to Him." Jesus answered and said, "This voice did not come because of Me, but for your sake. Now is the judgment of this world; now the ruler of this world will be cast out. And I, if I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all peoples to Myself." This He said, signifying by what death He would die. The people answered Him, "We have heard from the law that the Christ remains forever; and how can You say, 'The Son of Man must be lifted up'? Who is this Son of Man?" Then Jesus said to them, "A little while longer the light is with you. Walk while you have the light, lest darkness overtake you; he who walks in darkness does not know where he is going. While you have the light, believe in the light, that you may become sons of light." These things Jesus spoke, and departed, and was hidden from them. But although He had done so many signs before them, they did not believe in Him, that the word of Isaiah the prophet might be fulfilled, which he spoke: "LORD, who has believed our report? And to whom has the arm of the LORD been revealed?" Therefore they could not believe, because Isaiah said again: "He has blinded their eyes and hardened their hearts, Lest they should see with their eyes, Lest they should understand

with their hearts and turn, So that I should heal them." These things Isaiah said when he saw His glory and spoke of Him. Nevertheless even among the rulers many believed in Him, but because of the Pharisees they did not confess Him, lest they should be put out of the synagogue; for they loved the praise of men more than the praise of God.



You Have a Place At Grace

So also Christ did not glorify Himself to become High Priest, but it was He who said to Him: "You are My Son, Today I have begotten You." As He also says in another place: "You are a priest forever according to the order of Melchizedek" (Hebrews 5:5-6).

The writer of Hebrews quotes two passages from the Old Testament in connection to Christ. This isn't surprising given Jesus' words "you search the Scriptures, for in them you think you have eternal life; and these are they which testify of Me" (John 5:39). The Old Testament Scriptures testify to Christ, with Hebrews quoting two passages from the Psalms (Psalm 2:7 and Psalm 110:4) in reference to Jesus.

Melchizedek swiftly comes and goes in Genesis 14, but his importance shouldn't be understated. The fullest treatment of this "King of Righteousness" (the meaning of the name) comes in Hebrews 7, where the writer accounts for the quick entrance and exit of this King who blessed Abraham, saying he's "without father, without mother, without genealogy, having neither beginning of days nor end of life, but made like the Son of God, remains a priest continually" (Hebrews 7:3). There's no origin story for Melchizedek in Genesis. He has neither a beginning of days nor end and is both a king and priest. He is, as Luther says, a "type of Christ." Extra-biblical sources and traditions posit numerous possibilities on the precise identity of Melchizedek. Luther aligns with the general opinion of seeing this "King of Righteousness" as Shem, the son of Noah, saying "I am pleased with the general opinion that Melchizedek is Shem, because there was no greater patriarch at that time, especially in spiritual matters...he gained a reputation for righteousness because of his service in the church; for he taught the forgiveness of sins through the future Seed of the woman" (Luther, Genesis, vol.2, 382).

The eternal aspect of the priest Melchizedek is distinguished from the priestly order of Aaron which was no guarantor of salvation. The Law of Moses wouldn't save and thus we would need another High Priest, which would be that Seed of the woman according to the order of Melchizedek, not Levi, not Aaron, but that "King of Righteousness" described in a Christ-like manner by the writer of Hebrews. The point is to focus on Christ and His priesthood distinct from an earthly priesthood that could only foreshadow the sacrifice of Jesus' flesh. It's for this reason we can approach God's throne in confidence, knowing we are a "royal priesthood" (1 Peter 2:9) by dwelling in the High Priest Himself Who has ascended into the heavens and promises the Church lives with Him.

He is a "priest forever." It's that "forever" the Church anticipates and has by living with faith in our great High Priest who "for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God" (Hebrews 12:2).
